RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS Special Meeting November 10, 2016

The Shelby City Schools, Board of Education met in special session/ retreat on Thursday, November 10, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at Shelby Senior High School, 1 Whippet Way, Shelby OH 44875

1. Meeting called to Order

1.1 The meeting was opened by Mrs. White. Those present recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.1.2 The following board members were present; Lynn Friebel, Lorie White, Randy Terman and Scott Rose. Administrative personnel present included Tim Tarvin, Superintendent; Paul Walker, Assistant

4. Leadership Team Work Session

Tim Tarvin opened the Work Session by thanking those present for their time and interest. He distributed an outline of possible topics for discussion including the following:

• Building Activities:

Dowds – Kristin Kaple-Jones mentioned the Learning Like a Rock Star Program and planned Chores for Helpline among other highlights of the year so far.

Auburn - Kelly Kuhn summarized fall activities and Fitness programs at Auburn.

Shelby Middle School – Jeff Eichorn reviewed mentoring programming and mentioned the Gold Girls and Tae Kwon Do classes as examples of new programs offered at the building.

Approve Supplemental Contracts

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 Shelby High School – John Gies outlined several focal areas for the High School this year including; Positive Behavior Programs, ACT Prep and programs for at risk students Special Education/Gifted Report Sheri Mitchell presented an outline of the focus of the Special Education program. The goal of the program is creation of a system of prevention and inclusion of special education students with the general population. Tricia Kehl introduced herself to the group as the Talented and Gifted Coordinator, a new position for the district this year. Goals of the program for this year are improved identification of alented & gifted students and provision of assistance to staff in meeting the needs of this population. Nicole Studd noted that in the second year of the SOAR Program over 100 students are involved in online classes. The Whippet Academy, grade 9-12 students taking one or two online courses accounts for about 41 of these students. She noted that most of the students participating in online programming might otherwise have left the district for other online schools. Libie Anatra distributed a revised forecast updated for the recent renewal of the Emergency Levy. She emphasized the importance of the levy to the financial stability of the district and thanked all those involved in the campaign. State Foundation support to the district and salary and benefit costs were also discussed. Scott Harvey discussed Transportation and Building / Facilities issues. He reported that the Transfinder routing system is working well after an intense set-up effort this summer. Facilities concerns include the condition of the group rol of students with a quality nutrition program. Luke Foley and Nate Coffey demonstrated the new security camera system installed in all buildings this year. They also mentioned a new enail and software installation done this past summer.
