Regular Meeting April 27, 2020

The Shelby City Schools, Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, April 27, 2020 at 6:00 p. in the Middle School Library, 109 West Smiley Avenue, Shelby Ohio 44875.

Meeting called to order

4. Financial Information- COVID19 Impact

The governor indicated there could be a 10-20% reduction in State Aid. I am skeptical that FY22-23 State funding may be trimmed from the current FY19 levels as well.

Casinos have been closed since March 16. This revenue is not material but it could drop FY21 estimates by 40%.

School District Income Tax – waiting for the April payments to see. Since there was an extension, the revenue could be slightly decreased.

Property taxes – August 2020 and February 2021 collections will likely fall. The research from 2009-2011 suggest that may be as much as 4% to 6%. Regardless of current collections decreasing, we will collect these taxes in future settlements as delinquent taxes. We saw sharp increases in delinquency collections 1 to 2 years immediately following 2008 recession. This is equal to a cash flow timing issue where FY2021 unpaid taxes may simply be delayed to FY2022 and FY 2023. Interest is heading to below 1% for investments.

5.1. Curriculum Update- Mr. Paul Walker

Staff Development – working with LEADER IN ME, 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. Mr. Walker shared that everything happening in the District with the new Pk-8 building and the merging that was going to take place, we felt we could not pass this up. It is an evidenced based program, how much you put into it is how much you get out of it.

Administration will also meet tomorrow to work on a plan for moving forward. Food Distribution – serving 809 students today. Process is going very well and we have 30 staff each time.
