# **COVID-19** Policies

We would like to remind students and parents about our policies related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

\*All staff and students are required to wear masks unless they are eating or drinking, per the order from the Governor. The mask must cover the person's nose and mouth.

\*Students should bring a water bottle each day since we are not permitted to use our drinking fountains. At this time we do not have a way for students to refill their water bottles so they should be sure to bring enough water to last the day.

\*Please do not send your child to school if they are sick! We are following a CDC protocol recommended to us by our local health departments. With a positive case in our own district, as well as cases in neighboring districts, we must remain diligent about keeping students, with certain symptoms, at home for the recommended time frame. If your child is instructed to remain at home for a 10 day period based on their symptoms, they may return to school sooner with a physician's note indicating they have an alternate diagnosis, or evidence of a negative COVID-19 test.

While our county remains at a level red with a higher rate of transmission, a greater number of students may need to be sent home for this 10 day period. Once we return to a level orange or yellow, we will be back to following a more normal protocol for illness as we have in previous school years (as long as there has been no COVID-19 contact in your family or student). This includes remaining home until your student is fever, vomiting, and diarrhea free for 24 hours. For example, if we send a student home with a fever at 10 AM, they will need to stay home the following day as well for a complete 24 hours free of fever without the use of fever reducing medications.

We appreciate your willingness to work with us as we try to keep all of our staff and students safe in the best way we know how!

**MASKS** – Students are required to bring a mask to school every day and wear it the right way, over their mouth and nose. physical. Any student who does not have a current physical should get papers from the office as soon as possible. This paper must be signed by both a physician and a parent, and is good for one year. Another necessary form is a blue card with emergency information on it that can be picked up in the office or the coach will give them out at practice. All other forms must be filled out online from the school district website. Anyone with questions concerning athletics may call **Mike Walter at (419) 342–6587**.

Another item that is important to be able to participate in an athletic event is grades. Students must be passing at least five (5) academic classes in order to be eligible to play a sport. The grades will be from the 1st nine weeks grading period that ended on October 18th. If you have any questions on eligibility contact the middle school office.

Speaking of winter sports, our teams will be ready to begin practices soon. The Girls and Boys Basketball Programs will start their season October 23rd. Wrestling will start the first week in November. Conditioning/open gyms/open mats have already begun for these sports. Please call the office to find out the time and location of these open gyms.

There are many questions concerning what winter sports are going to look like. There normally is a mandatory meeting for any athlete wanting to play a winter sport. However, like the fall sports, there will be a video online to view and the individual coaches will hold their own meeting. These meetings will more than likely take place in a zoom meeting. Further details will come as we find out more information about winter sports and we will pass on the information as quickly to you as we find out more.

## GUIDANCE Ohio Means Jobs Website - Dare Program Guidance Counselor - Chris Zuercher

I hope everyone is doing well during a different school year. We are in the process of getting our 8th graders ready for high school and a few ways we do this is by a Job Shadowing Program and a visit to Pioneer. This year, unfortunately, we can't do the Job Shadowing Program. Our trip to Pioneer is going to be a virtual trip, while normally we are there in person. We are working with Pioneer on how we are going to be able to do this virtually. One thing we have been able to do, so far, is have Jim Sorenson from Pioneer come over and have a three day discussion with our 8th grade students on the Ohio Means Jobs website. This site allows students to look at their future career. It allows students to look at current and future jobs and how to get where they want to go. It also has a great college search program.

Right now the 5th graders are going through the D.A.R.E. program. Each week, students get to meet one time with Officer Swisher as he goes over everything from effects of smoking to problem solving skills and ways to deal with stress. This is a great program and it will continue to the end of the first semester in December. So far, the year is flying by and we are hoping for a great second quarter.



# **BUS CONDUCT**

Your child will bring home information regarding our <u>Cookie Dough Sale in January</u>! This Cookie Dough Sale is not your typical fundraiser where the proceeds go to an organization or the school. ALL OF THE PROFITS FROM THIS FUNDRAISER GO DIRECTLY TO HELPING YOUR CHILD PAY FOR THEIR 6TH GRADE CAMP NUHOP EXPENSES AND/OR 8TH GRADE TRIP TO WASHINGTON, DC.

Here is how it works. From January 29–February 12, your child will be selling a variety of cookie dough. If your child sells "X" amount of cookie dough; 50% of the total sales goes directly into their student account that can be used for these two trips only. When the date comes to pay for these two trips, your total amount due will be reduced by the amount you have saved during your time here at SMS. So...rather than Mom and Dad digging into their pockets, if your child has \$100 dollars in his/her account from selling cookie dough, that money is deducted from the cost of the trip.
