Financial Overview

Shelby City Schools remains committed to responsible financial management, ensuring that resources are used effectively to support our students and staff. In the 2023-24 fiscal year, the district's funding came from a variety of sources, including local, state, and federal contributions, as well as grants.

A Strong Showing: Shelby Schools Meets and Exceeds State Standards

Each year, the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce releases State Report Cards, which highlight the achievements of school districts across the state and their efforts to prepare students for the future.

Districts are given an overall rating of 1-5 stars, with five being the highest. Additionally, districts are scored in the following categories: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Early Literacy and Graduation.

We are happy to report that for the 2023-2024 school year, we maintained our rating of 4 stars and were just shy of achieving a 4.5-star rating. Additionally, we met or exceeded state standards in all graded categories.

Shelby High School Graduates Earn National Recognitions

Toby Randall and Kailyn Schwall, Class of 2024, were awarded academic honors from the College Board's national recognition programs. Both received the National Rural and Small Town Award, which celebrates students' hard work in high school and showcases their strong academic performance. To qualify for the award, students must have a grade point average of 3.5 or higher, a PSAT/NMQST score in the top 10% of all test takers in Ohio, and attend school in a small town or rural area.

STEM for Grades K-8

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education now begins in elementary school and continues through middle school. This hands-on, exploratory program helps students develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills while sparking curiosity in these key areas.

Our new career coach at the high school is dedicated to guiding students in planning for their futures. Whether they're considering college, trade school, or direct entry into the workforce, the career coach provides individualized support and resources.

Driver's Education

High school students can now take advantage of a new Driver's Education program, designed to teach the essential skills needed to navigate the road safely and confidently.
